5.1 Principal report

- No questions about Ski Camp EOTC, and a comprehensive report was provided. We
 discussed bad weather and being stuck on the mountain. Look at 'slippers' instead of
 chains for both vans before the next camp for ease of putting on. Some children were
 challenged staying overnight.
- The swimming pool crack will be addressed in Term 4
- Rona has a chat with Tony about any Health and Safety issues. Tony raised that the cobbles under the tree by B Block are lifted by tree roots, some are missing, and students are also digging them up.
- There is a high need for ORS students coming shortly; applications for assistance have been approved.
- Krystal spoke to the data. There have been improvements, still work to do but trending upwards. Year 2's are making good progress. Andrea invited the board to come into classes in the morning to observe.
- John queried the breakdown with the data i.e. no separate stats for Maori achievement. Breakdowns will be discussed later in the year, concentrating on the school as a whole and looking at the progress made. New programs have had an impact.
- We are part of a Learning Support Register with other Te Puke Schools to track students with extra needs. This information will go with them from school to school.
- Staff are loving the LLLL program. (Little Learners Love Literacy)
- Numicon, we have been funded for PD which is coming up

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• The Resilience Project (Tanya Dalton Foundation) is pulling out of New Zealand and will operate in Australia only, no longer financially sustainable. Local schools will look at their own programs as there is value in continuing the project, under a different name.

- TPI Open Night for Year 6's clashes with our school production first night. Krystal talking with Jill Wheeldon regarding an alternative just for our students so they don't miss out.
